The key to growing and for that matter hunting mature bucks can be boiled down to two words; "low" and "impact." Alone they mean little; together they are the Rosetta Stone of big buck hunting. If you take anything away from reading this book, let it be those two words...

...the notion that an entire population of bucks or for that matter any given buck is proceeding in a lock-step manner through a pre-determined sequence of behaviors is nonsense.
